Systemic and Family Therapy Practice 4 Day Introductory Workshop 2025

About Family and Systemic Therapy

Some of the significant contributions of the systemic approach have been its attention to the patterns of interactions around symptoms, its placement of problems within context, and its efforts to understand the belief systems underpinning people's responses to one another and to the problem. This workshop will focus on how systemic therapy is now integrated with narrative, dialogic and solution focused approaches, creating a nimble and tailored response to problems.

Workshop Overview

This popular course, run since 2004, will introduce the key principles of systemic and family therapy practice as well as provide many opportunities to practice core family therapy skills, such as, developing systemic conceptualisations of problems, generating systemic hypotheses, using circular and relationship questions to bring out and evaluate problematic patterns. The workshop will also assist with the implications of making the shift from working with an individual to working with families.

Overview of Format

- Learning is facilitated via daily article seminars, theory presentations, observation of demonstration interviews, simulation of family interviews, skill development exercises.

- Exploring the influences of the participants' beliefs and context on the therapist/ client relationship.

Key Outcomes

- To understand the theoretical underpinning of the systemic approach.
- To develop circular thinking for eliciting the patterns of interconnectedness around problems.
- To appreciate and evaluate the influence of context and history on meanings ascribed to problems.
- To gain clinical skills in the practice of systemic hypothesising and questioning to elicit a relational and contextual understanding of the problem.
- To include the referring context and wider systems in the hypothesising and interviewing process.
- To understand the therapeutic and creative importance of therapeutic curiosity in the work with families.
- Designing systemic therapeutic interventions.
- Developing reflecting team skills.
